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**DEFINITIONS**

**Section 3 Contractor:** A business concern that provides economic opportunities to low- and very low-income residents of the metropolitan area (or non-metropolitan county), including a business concern that is 51 percent or more owned by low- or very low-income residents; employs a substantial number of low- or very low-income residents; or provides subcontracting or business development opportunities to businesses owned by low- or very low-income residents. Low- and very low-income residents include participants in Youth build programs established under Subtitle D of Title IV of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act.

**Very low-and Low Income Persons:** **Very low-Income** persons means low-income families (including single persons) whose incomes do not exceed 50 percent of the HUD median family income limits for the area. The 2013 income limits are set forth below. **Low-Income** persons mean families (including single persons) whose incomes do not exceed 80 percent of the HUD median income limits for the area.
