### State launches foreclosure prevention website and names the Housing Authority of Yamhill County as local partner

Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) has launched a new website ([www.oregonhomeownerhelp.org](http://www.oregonhomeownerhelp.org)) and identified the Housing Authority of Yamhill County to help deliver the state's Mortgage Payment Assistance (MPA) program in Yamhill County. The funding for this program comes from the U.S. Department of Treasury's Housing Finance Agency Innovation Fund for the Hardest Hit Housing Markets.

On December 10, OHCS will open an online application for the MPA program at [www.oregonhomeownerhelp.org](http://www.oregonhomeownerhelp.org). The Housing Authority of Yamhill County will help homeowners throughout the application process.

"We are pleased to have the Housing Authority of Yamhill County ready to help Yamhill County homeowners who are struggling to pay their mortgages," said Victor Merced, OHCS director.

"The Housing Authority of Yamhill County will help ensure that eligible homeowners in our county have an opportunity to get help with their mortgages," said Jonia Pierce. Treasury established the Hardest Hit Fund in February 2010 to provide aid to homeowners in states hit hard by the economic and housing market downturn. In total, Treasury awarded \$220 million in foreclosure prevention resources to Oregon.
